### Heritage Center Looks at Women's Suffrage in Oberlin

AmeriCorps/Ohio History Service Corps member **Riley Thomas** presents a community program on the Oberlinians who fought for women's suffrage, working against discrimination on the basis of both race and sex. Drawing from newspaper accounts and historical records, Thomas explores activism in a small town and discusses how it connected to the larger movement and events that led up to Ohio's ratification of the 19<sup>th</sup> Amendment in 1919 and national ratification in 1920. ***Local Activism, National Impact: Women's Suffrage in Oberlin*** is hosted by the Oberlin Heritage Center and it is free and open to the public. Choose to attend either **Thursday, August 1, at 6:00 p.m. at the Oberlin Public Library's Community Room** (65 South Main Street) or **Tuesday, August 13 at 7:15 p.m. at Kendal at Oberlin's Heiser Auditorium** (600 Kendal Drive).

Riley Thomas has spent the past year at the Heritage Center as a member of the AmeriCorps/Ohio History Service Corps – a program funded by ServeOhio, Ohio's commission on service and volunteerism. At the Oberlin Heritage Center, Riley spends half her time helping with OHC tours, social media administration, and special projects, while spending the other half in service to local history organizations throughout a five-county region in northeast Ohio. A native of Avon Lake, she received her undergraduate degree in Art Conservation and Anthropology from the University of Delaware in 2018. She will complete her year of service as an AmeriCorps member in August and will begin a six-month internship in conservation techniques later this fall in Washington, DC through the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian.

### Trustee of the Month: Sue Carrier Graham

I grew up in Lakewood, OH where my father, Harold Carrier, owned a small drug store only a few blocks from our home. It was not until we moved to Twinsburg in 1992 that I learned that my father's uncle, Arthur Willis Carrier, was Twinsburg's first school superintendent in the 1890's.

I graduated from Lakewood High School in 1953, attended Baldwin-Wallace the following year, then transferred to and graduated from Wittenberg University in Springfield, OH in 1957 receiving a degree in elementary education. My husband Jerry also graduated from Wittenberg with a degree in history and political science. Then went on for a Masters from Vanderbilt University in Nashville, TN while I taught in the public schools there.

After teaching stints for Jerry in Kettering, OH then as a Instructor of Political Science at Wittenberg, where I taught a preschool program, we moved to Shaker Heights, OH in 1965 and for many years I taught in a preschool coop and then worked in the Children's Room of the Shaker public library while my husband taught at Shaker Heights High School.

We moved to Twinsburg in 1992 where I developed and taught a preschool program entitled "Nature Nook" which was a part of Twinsburg's Department of Parks and Recreation. In addition, I was a volunteer at the South Chagrin Reservation of the Cleveland Metro Parks and at the Twinsburg Liberty Park. I also volunteered with a group assisting our naturalist, Stanley Stine.
