A JOURNEY DOWN SOM CENTER ROAD, NORTH STREET. ROUTE 91,DARROW ROAD, OR AS YOU LIKE IT

Most memorable to me was a Jewel family in the little house. Treva Jewel, just only age, became, in a month, the most interesting eleven year old I'd ever seen, and I didn't know why. She had light brown hair, green eyes. The title of mere Queen would have been an affront to my estimate of her standing in my esteem. A small stream flowed gently from the ledges behind the house out to the road. A plank had been placed across the stream for pedestrian convenience.

Thereon, one day with the sun creating an auburn halo around her head, Treva and I sat, our bare feet in the water. The stars stopped in their courses for one of the golden moments of my life.

Other families came and went, but I never learned what became of my Jewel.

Just across the road from the Jewel house lived an elderly lady named Wilcox. It was our supposition, probably totally unfounded, that she was in some way connected with the Wilcox twins after whose siblingual connection the town was named.

In any event, old Miss Wilcox kept pretty much to herself but was known to bring wintergreen candies out to very young people trudging by in mud, sand, or snow.

The house is now and for many years last past has been occupied by the Edgar Percy family, good friends of modern times, Edgar himself an occasional tennis companion of earlier days.
