

SOLON TO TWINSBURG

A JOURNEY DOWN SOM CENTER ROAD, NORTH STREET. ROUTE 91,DARROW ROAD, OR AS YOU LIKE IT By William T. Gillie

Part 17

Katie Bonner's neighbors, about one hundred yards down the road, were Davies, later to become residents of our farm, and a numerous tribe of Dunscombes. The two families occupied the same large house just north of the tracks of the Wheeling and Lake Erie CW & LE, often renamed the Walk and Leave Early).

The Dunscombes kept to themselves although one of the older boys, Aubrey, put in some time as a hired hand on our farm.

The Davies family occupied the rear or west end of our house while Kate and I lived in the front half for a year in our first family home, for Douglas, our first-born, arrived during that happy but eventful year for the world. World War II started for us just then. The Davies were very easy close neighbors, not in any way imposing on time or privacy yet always there if neighbors were needed.

Across from the Davies/Dunscombe menage, thus, on the west side of the road north of the tracks, lived the family of Ed Gill, one of whose sons, Jay, I believe, attended what is now Kent State University, played football there, and served as strongman at carnivals and fairs. Impressive to all the young males of the community was the fact or rumor that the younger Gill had, in experiencing difficulty with a steer, taken such action that the steer died, its neck broken.

Moving south of the railroad, on the west side of the road was a house built by my grandfather who built several houses in Twinsburg. Its occupants were unknown to me but I literally broke a bicycle and very nearly myself in two on a
