

moustache exactly like that which I now see in my mirror.

There was no clutter of junk mail to weigh down his buggy.

Mrs. Chambers was a star. She was matronly with snow-white hair and would probably have denied a charge of beguiling youngsters into stopping for a chat by the production and display of a large blue cookie jar, usually full, at first. She loved children and they knew it.

Near the town itself were a pair of sisters Effie and Eloda Holt. Their father, a respected elder in the community lived with his two daughters. The house was at the very edge of the stores which made up the town.

Once, in front of their house, I, at 11 or 12, still fairly small in stature, had difficulty with a fractious horse who was determined I was not going to get into the buggy I had driven to town. One of the Holt ladies, perceiving my plight, came out and held the beast until I could get one foot on the mounting step and then the other on the floor of the buggy. The gratitude I felt is still fresh in my memory for I had reached a point at which I would gladly have terminated the horse had that been in my power.

The Holt sisters were regular church-goers and, in their quiet way, pillars of the community.

This Month in History: February

February 1, 1960 - In Greensboro, North Carolina, four African American students sat down and ordered coffee at a lunch counter inside a Woolworth's store. They were refused service, but did not leave. Instead, they waited all day. The scene was repeated over the next few days, with protests spreading to other southern states, resulting in the eventual arrest of over 1,600 persons for participating in sit-ins.

February 14, 1929 - The St. Valentine's Day massacre occurred in Chicago as seven members of the Bugs Moran gang were gunned down by five of Al Capone's mobsters posing as police.

February 23, 1942 - During World War II, the first attack on the U.S. mainland occurred as a Japanese submarine shelled an oil refinery near Santa Barbara, California, causing minor damage.
